Greens Proposal

- We want to improve the greens so they are playable for longer through the season.
- Installation of new 'herringbone' drainage
- Will make the greens more resilient to predicted wetter weather all year round.
- Cost per green Between £3,000 £4,500
- 10 Year project



The Plan

Each green will be dug up in turn and new 2 meter herringbone drains will be inserted in to the greens, these drains will then be connected to brand new drains which will drain the water to specific points on the golf course designed to take the water off the course. This will not only improve the greens but also the surrounding area which will make the greens playable for most of the year.

The plan is to do the following greens in order

Year 1 = 5th Green, Year 2 = 9th Green, Year 3 = 6th Green,

Year 4 = 7th Green, Year 5 = 4th Green, Year 6 = 1st Green,

Year 7 = 13th Green, Year 8 = 3rd Green, Year 9 = 2nd Green



Greens Proposal - Funding

- This just cannot be funded via normal club funds.
- Members to fund the project via a £50 per year, Greens Levey, to be paid in October 2017 as a one of fee and after that it can be added to you golf subs standing order stating in 2018
- We will attempt to hold the membership at its current level, for the next 3 years as a minimum unless we are in serious
- The £50 greens Levey will be 'ring-fenced' for this project and will be fully audited and documented to members.
- Your money will go directly to the greens, starting October'17
